INCARCERATION

This is something to read and consider – let's share our ideas:

On July 26, 2015, five Presbyterian women and myself attended a seminar on Incarceration at the Irvine United Church of Christ. It began with several speakers: Donald Craig, President of the Orange County NAACP; Monica Brasov-Curca of OCCCO (Orange County Church Community Organization) and David Gist of Bread for the World.

Bread for the World has focused on incarceration as part of their Hunger Project. A fact sheet informed us that the US population accounts for only 5% of the world's population but nearly 22% of the prison population. Since 1980 the US prison population has quadrupled, an increase largely due to higher penalties for non-violent offenses. While prison building costs escalate, many states have reduced funding for education, rehabilitation, and other programs. 2.2 million people reside in prisons or jails, a 500% increase over the past 30 years. Over 60% of people in prison are people of color. Nearly half of all federal prisoners are serving time for drug offenses. African-Americans make up 14% of drug users but comprise 37% of those arrested for drug offenses. All of these statements were documented.

What can we do to reform this situation? Bread for the World says we should reduce the prison population and eliminate bias that leads to discriminatory incarceration. We should treat incarcerated people humanely in ways that reduce recidivism and promote a successful reentry into the community. Reduce hunger and poverty among the formerly incarcerated population and their families.

Bread for the World also informed us of pending bi-partisan bills before Congress affecting criminal justice and urged us to write letters/emails of support to our local legislators and further, to pay them a visit.

Donald Craig of the NAACP spoke about how the criminal justice system affects African-Americans. Monica Brasov-Curca spoke about white privilege, race riots, and the Three Strikes law.

It was an impressive program and motivated those/us present to do something, beginning with educating our churches. I wanted to propose that we offer a similar program to Presbyterian women, perhaps on Feb. 27 at St. Mark if you all agree and the church is available. I think there is some urgency to this subject as we are spending more on prisons than education, the growth of private prisons with little federal jurisdiction is accelerating. I feel sure that we could get these speakers or others equally competent for our program.

Progressive Christians Uniting sponsored a talk by Michelle Alexander who wrote the book, *The New Jim Crow*, which I also recommend reading.

Her social worker asked for a bedside commode, adult diapers and Ensure. AIN provided all she requested, along with a friendly home visit. Jeremy* survived a gunshot wound a year ago. He is part of a trauma support group at LAC+ USC medical center that meets every Friday. One Friday the group was throwing a baby shower for Jeremy and his partner. His social worker requested a "starter kit" with baby things. AIN sent a lovely gift bag with a few essentials. After all they'd been through it was a treat for the trauma group and Jeremy's family to have something to celebrate.

David* fell off a roof top and fractured his heel. Unable to work for a few months and sole provider for his family, he was falling behind in his rent. AIN was able to help with \$100.00 to help his family keep their home until David gets back to work.

NEWS FROM OUR SYNOD MODERATOR . . .

Hello Everyone,

At the PWS Coordinating Team meeting yesterday at Covenant Presbyterian of Westchester, we agreed to recommend suspension of our bylaws (posted on pages 20-23 of our Directory for 2014-2015). We came to this decision because of changes in the need for certain positions and a desire to remain flexible to adapt to the needs of the women within our bounds. We do not know how the General Assembly will deal with the realignment of the Synods. We felt it made no sense to spend time on redoing the current bylaws when the environment remains uncertain. We will take this to the membership on September 26, 2015, at our Fall Gathering "One Body, One Spirit" in Placentia Presbyterian Church beginning at 9:30 a.m. This announcement should be circulated widely among all the membership so that all are aware of this proposed action. We will also be voting on the budget for 2016-2018. Our budget is for 3 calendar years. A flyer is attached so that the information about the Fall Gathering is available.

The Coordinating Team is excited about the direction we are moving to live into "One Body." We particularly commend the latest issue of Horizons magazine for July/August 2015, on Mission and Racism. We will be sending more information out soon. By the way, save the dates of July 15-17, 2016, for our summer conference featuring Judy Siker, author of the 2016-2017 Bible study on "Who is Jesus, What a Difference a Lens Makes".

Because of a commitment I had made before I was elected Moderator, I will be unable to attend the Fall Gathering. I will miss being a part of this great day. I wish you all a terrific experience.




