**Mission Priorities**

Worldwide Mission Partnership (WMP) has funds available to encourage and facilitate global and local mission activities. These activities should align themselves with the priorities of PC(USA) mission, namely:

1. Strengthening the Church's capacity to survive, to thrive, and to witness to the good news in Jesus Christ.
2. Addressing the root causes of poverty including the negative effects of economic globalization on the poorest and most vulnerable in society, paying special attention to women and children.
3. Engaging in reconciliation amidst cultures of violence.

**How to Apply**

Demonstrate in an application of five pages or fewer how your ministry or project meets the grant criteria below. Make sure to include the dollar amount of your request.

**Grant Criteria**

The amount of the grant may be up to \$5000 per year and may be renewed for two years. Grant applications (5 pages or fewer) will be reviewed for the following characteristics:

- a. Participation of two or more churches within the Presbytery
- b. Cross-economic, cross-cultural or cross-ethnic partnership, locally or globally
- c. Focus to share the good news, meet the needs of the poor and disadvantaged (e.g., health, food, or education), and reconciliation
- d. Self-sustainability and multiplication of efforts
- e. Other funds invested by partners
- f. Must be financially supporting PC(USA) and the Presbytery of Los Ranchos
- g. Must be effective champion to communicate the work of this Partnership to the world
